Welcome to the Village

The TOS thank Matthew and Dug from RUAH Homeless drop in Centre, who gave a dynamic and powerful educational presentation on the evening of Tuesday, 26 July. These two men explained the reality of homelessness in a vivid and heart wrenching way. The audience was stunned into quiet compassion.

Dug's distinguished presence belied the suffering he has experienced. He is a compelling speaker as he shared with us his past as a Rabbi, a UN worker in Bosnia (where he was shot and blown up), followed by a small business as a defence truck driver. As a driver, he was targeted and assaulted by an outlawed motorcycle gang, which caused Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. This event started his descent into homelessness and illness.

Eventually, Dug found his way to Matthew and the RUAH team and his life turned around. Dug now has a home and has a small business walking dogs.

Dug explained how important and useful the TOS backpacks are to homeless people. The backpacks may be the person's only possession. Items such as torches, ponchos and socks are very well received.

Imagine being homeless right now. This winter has been bitterly cold and wet. I think of the mornings when it is 1 degree and I debate getting out of my warm, cosy bed. Apparently, the nights are the most dangerous time if you are homeless. There is always the risk of being assaulted and of course the cold. Nights are long, and the cold ensures illness is never far away. We honour RUAH, Matthew and Dug. They are changing the world into a better place right here in Perth. The TOS has recently been given a large collection of metaphysical and esoteric books, all of which were previously owned by the late Mr. Marmaduke (Duke) Herford-Alley. The donation was organised and delivered to our door by the granddaughter of Mr. Herford-Alley, Shea Halge, and we thank Shea and her family for their generous contribution to our TOS fund raising efforts. We shared these books between the TS Library and our TOS gift stall.

As a result of the new input of stock, we have been able to turn over and regenerate the books on the gift table, and sales were brisk at the recent TOS night (July 26). We have a wide ranging variety of topics, including health, healing, meditation, various religions and traditions, karma, reincarnation, etc, everything from astrology to Zen, as they say.

One of Mr. Herford-Alley's many interests was palmistry. His teacher was the renowned palmist Noel Jacquin, and we have got several books by this author, as well as a number of other excellent books on the subject.

Another interesting book is Barbara Thiering's <u>Jesus The Man</u>. Barbara Thiering was an Australian historian, theologian and biblical scholar. She wrote this non-fiction book as a new analysis of the life of Jesus as gleaned from her study of the Dead Sea Scrolls. The book attracted a lot of attention when it was first published in 1992 and was well reviewed across a range of media.

Also, if you are familiar with the 'New York Times bestselling author of Medicine Woman', Lynn Andrews, we have a copy of her book Windhorse Woman. This takes her on her spiritual quest into Nepal and the Himalayas, accompanied by her mentor, the Native American shaman Agnes Whistling Elk.

TOS - August 16 movie fund raiser



Truman (109 mins)

When theatre actor Julián (Darín) receives an unexpected visit from his childhood friend Tomás (Cámara), the encounter is bittersweet. This reunion is their first meeting in many years, triggered by Julian's failing health. Tomas is baffled by his friend's decision to forgo treatment and instead focus on putting his affairs in order: distributing possessions, reconciling past disputes, and, most importantly, finding a home for his beloved Boxer, Truman. It's this task that is causing Julián the greatest concern.

Over four days, the two men walk the streets of Madrid, visiting bookshops, restaurants, doctors, and veterinarians, and examine their lives – their loves, successes and failures – speculating on what the future holds.

In this jewel of a film, Cámara and Darin deliver a master class in screen acting, convincingly depicting the ease and rapport that only a life-long connection allows. With characteristic understatement and sensitivity, Gay finds great dignity and humour in ordinary lives, delivering a witty, moving and hugely entertaining reflection on male relationships, and a reminder that the best friendships are indeed, forever.
